



Forward Leadership Program Information

Thank you for your interest in API Forward Foundation’s Forward Leadership Program for undergraduate college students. The program aims to inspire, motivate and empower students to develop their leadership potential. Through three to four months of mentorship, collaboration and leadership training, we hope to instill confidence, integrity, knowledge, experience, connection and great understanding of the importance of equity practice. Our program hopes to inspire participants to lead change for Asians, Pacific Islanders and others.

This program comprises five components:

1. Leadership training
2. Pairing with mentors
3. Research and field work
4. Project presentation
5. “Pay it forward” volunteer work with a nonprofit organization

Participants of the API Forward Foundation’s Forward Leadership Program must participate in all five components.

Learning outcomes:

- Navigating power relationships and dynamics
- Conflict resolution skills
- Negotiation skills
- Leading across cultures
- Planning and delivering effective presentations
- Identifying and mitigating unconscious bias
- Fostering an inclusive climate at work or school
- Becoming a strong and compassionate leader
- Interpersonal communication skills
- Time management skills

Timeline:

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Expectations:

Applicants who are selected are expected to participate in all components of the program, including 4 virtual workshops (starting in December 2020), a day-long leadership conference in January, and monthly meeting with a mentor. They will also work in teams on a project arranged by API Forward in partnership with a government agency, community or non-profit organization. The project will focus on issues related to diversity, inclusion and/or equity.

The final presentations will be judged by a team of community members. Upon completion, participants will be financially rewarded for their work and join a growing network of API change-makers in the Pacific Northwest. Graduates of this program will be required to volunteer for at least 20 hours of services at a nonprofit within 18 months after completion of this program. API Forward will assist in matching the student with a nonprofit organization.

All applicants will be required to:

- Attend 4 virtual online workshops (2 hours each) beginning in December 2020.
- Attend a day-long leadership conference in January 2021.
- Agree to participate in a mentorship program.
- Dedicate time to research, planning and implementing the assigned project.
- Be available for the final presentation in late April.
- Attend the API Forward fundraising event in May.
- Commit to a minimum of 20 hours of volunteer work at a local nonprofit organization.

Ideal candidate:

- Self identifies as an API community member.
- Willing and open to learn about diversity, inclusion and equity in API community.
- Strong desire to become a leader in the API community.
- Currently enrolled at least part time (with six credits or more) in a higher education institution in Oregon or southwest Washington.
- Be at least 18 years old by December 10, 2020.

Benefits of this program:

- Opportunity to engage in diversity, inclusion and equity work in the Oregon and Washington.
- Opportunity to participate in leadership training.
- Opportunity to build relationship with local government, private industries, and/or communities that are not offered in regular classes.
- Opportunity to gain hands-on knowledge of community-based equity work.
- Award stipend (\$500-\$1,500 per applicant) toward educational cost.

*Disclosure: Applicants must disclose any personal relationships with an active board member.

Eligibility

API Forward's mission is to develop, through education, civically-engaged, socially-responsible Asian American and Pacific Island leaders and professionals.

To be considered, applicant must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- Be at least 18 years old by December 10, 2020.
- Enrolled in a college or university in Oregon or southwest Washington.
- Enrolled in at least half time (6 or more credit hours).
- Current student must have a minimum of 2.0 cumulative GPA.
- Preference given to self-identified Asian Pacific American Islanders.
- Must be a U.S. resident or a citizen (excluding students with a F-1, J-1 and other international student visa types).

Checklist for a completed application packet*:

- Complete essays
- Unofficial transcript
- Resume (include extracurricular activities, work history, volunteer/service experience, awards and honors)
- Two letters of recommendation addressing your academic ability, leadership potential and other qualities
